<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Recruit additional teachers in English and Maths to reduce class sizes in the more able groups in KS4 on the Sleaford site; Run small-group intervention for students who need tailored support, in Mathematics and English, prioritising students who are eligible for the Pupil Premium; Widen the Intervention strategy to also incorporate Science and Humanities Learning Mentors, in order to provide additional intervention support for eligible students where needed; Invite students to request intervention in the Autumn term of Year 11 outside of school time, to accommodate a wider range of students, with no impact on lesson time; More closely coordinate the selection of students, and evaluation of impact from the intervention across all subjects involved, ensuring one person is responsible for the coordination of this within each subject area; Provide revision guides and workbooks for eligible students across Maths, English, Science, and Humanities.
