Year 9 Exam Week - Tuesday 7 May-Friday 10 May 2024

As you will have seen from the termly calendar, Year 9 exams will commence the week beginning 7 May 2024.

During this week students will attend their usual lessons and during some of these lessons they will sit an examination for that subject. Students will be given an exam timetable next week which shows when each exam will happen for each subject. This ensures that the exams are spaced out so students do not have too many exams on a certain day. The examinations aim to provide students with an opportunity to sit test papers that cover a wider range of topics than a typical termly assessment would and are good preparation for GCSE. In terms of revision, the most effective strategies include: mind maps, revision posters and key point cards. On the next page you will see some helpful guidance on how to make revision effective and manageable.


Revision Tips



Split revision into **20 minute sessions** to retain focus and benefit from the **FLORA** memory process. The mind remembers certain information more easily. Things we see or read **FIRST**, **LAST**, that are **OUTSTANDING**, **REPEATED** and that we **ASSOCIATE** with other words are remembered more easily.

With 3 x 20 minutes there will be 3 firsts, 3 lasts, etc.

Transform information you read into more useful revision resources such as mind maps and flashcards.



Recall: test yourself or ask your parents to test you so you can see whether you have retained the information. Repeat any you can't remember as many times as necessary.

Following the completion of the Year 9 exams, teachers will use the outcomes to help inform the next set of interim grades which will include an examination grade and for the first time a 'predicted' grade for the end of the GCSE course.
