We are writing to you to let you know of the revision materials we have to enable you to achieve your full potential in your upcoming GCE examinations.

The key to success in Mathematics is practise; therefore it is important that you begin your revision as early as possible. Your revision should include a combination of reviewing topics you have studied across Year 12 and 13 and exam-style questions.

The examination board has released advance information for your GCE examination. For each paper, the lists show the major focus of the content of the exams. The questions will be drawn from one or more of these areas of specification content and the information is presented in the order it appears in the specification and not in question order. This means that you need to revise a broad range of question styles to cover all levels of difficulty within a topic area. The advance information is also included in this pack.

Alongside the notes and examples you record in class, you have access to a number of useful resources, as detailed below.
