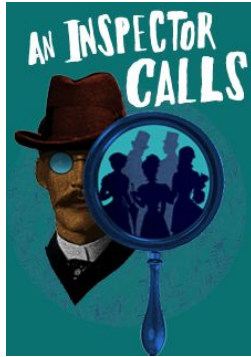


The importance of READING

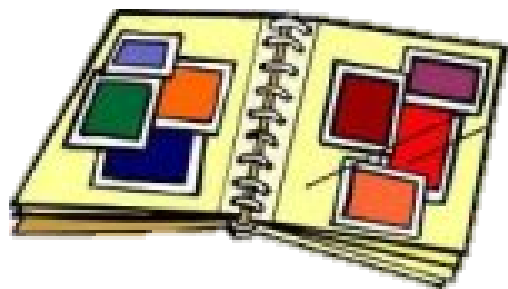
Local Events
